Hypothermia Week is Coming Soon!

Our parish will welcome up to 45 homeless guests for Hypothermia Week from **Jan. 14th through the 21st**. For those unfamiliar with our hypothermia program, St. Mary's provides overnight shelter, hot meals, and other help for our homeless guests (~45) for a full week. Other churches cover the remaining 17 weeks of the wintery season.

We will need a lot of volunteer help during the week itself. In recent years, much of our help has come from our senior community. While they are greatly appreciated and will be needed again this year, we urge younger adults to prayerfully consider participating, possibly by taking on a weekday overnight shift.

Volunteer signups for adults and teens via SignUp Genius will begin on **Dec. 18th** at 6 p.m. Volunteer sign-up boards will begin in the Worship Center on **Dec. 31st** at 4 pm. These sign-up boards will include our many requests for donations of food and guest items as well as for emergency drivers in case of snow issues.

First World Day of the Poor

Blessed are the hands that reach beyond every barrier of culture, religion and nationality, and pour the balm of consolation over the wounds of humanity. Blessed are the open hands that ask nothing in exchange, with no "ifs" or "buts" or "maybes": they are hands that call down God's blessing upon their brothers and sisters." As a parish we will offer two opportunities in response to the Pope's teaching. On Nov. 14th, we will host a Budgeting & Money Management Workshop, and on Nov. 19th we will contribute our Fall Harvest food collection to the Saint Lucy Project. Both of these will support the poor and financially disadvantaged in our community. We ask all parishioners to continue to support our community's efforts to assist those in need during this week, on the first World Day of the Poor and all during the year, and to consider the Pope's message that's addressed to each of us: "Let us love, not with words but with deeds."

High School Placement Test For Non-Diocesan School 8th Graders

Eighth grade students attending public schools or non-Catholic private schools who are interested in attending Catholic High Schools in the Diocese of Arlington need to take the High School Placement Test (HSPT) offered on Saturday, Dec. 2nd, or Saturday, Jan. 6, 2018. This test is required for placement at Bishop Ireton High School, Bishop O'Connell High School, Paul VI High School and Saint John Paul the Great High School. Students must fill out an HSPT Registration Form (available under "Frequently Asked Questions" under Schools at <http://www.arlingtondiocese.org/>), and submit to the test site by Nov. 30th for the December test.

Normally, a RMD from an IRA is taxed as income. However, tax laws allow individuals 70½ or older to make a direct IRA distribution to a charity. Such qualified direct distributions to charity are not subject to income tax and can fulfill your RMD.
