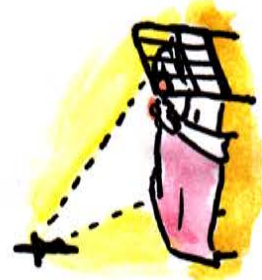
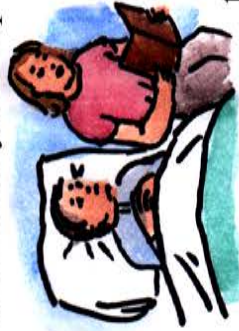
When People are Sick...

2. Always pray for people who are sick. Your prayers can help them get better, or they might help your sick friend to understand why God is letting them suffer.



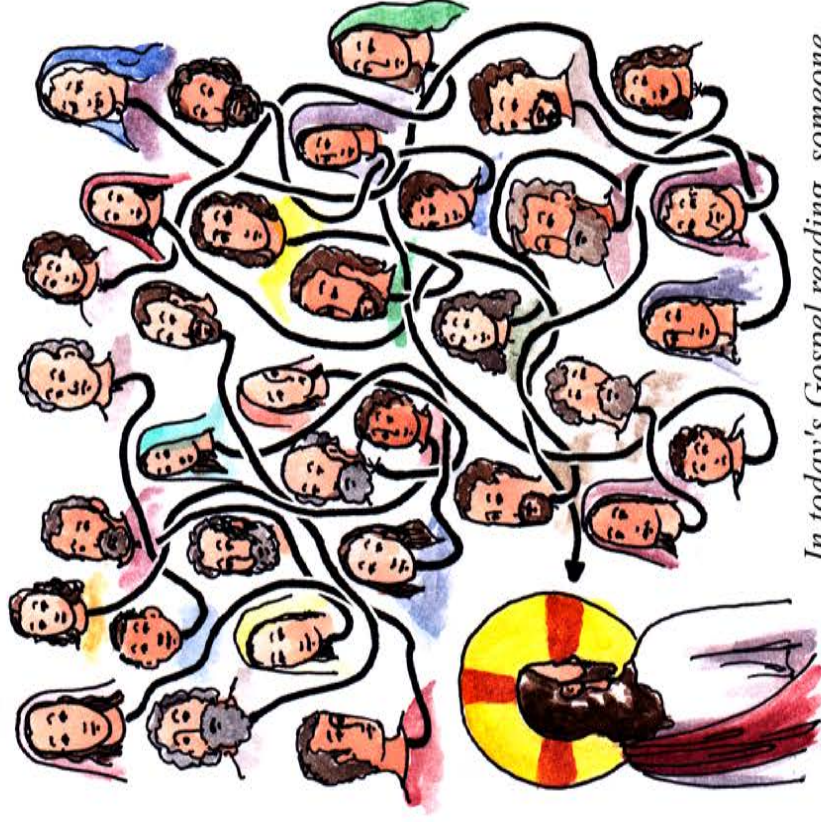

I've heard the new hospital is excellent!

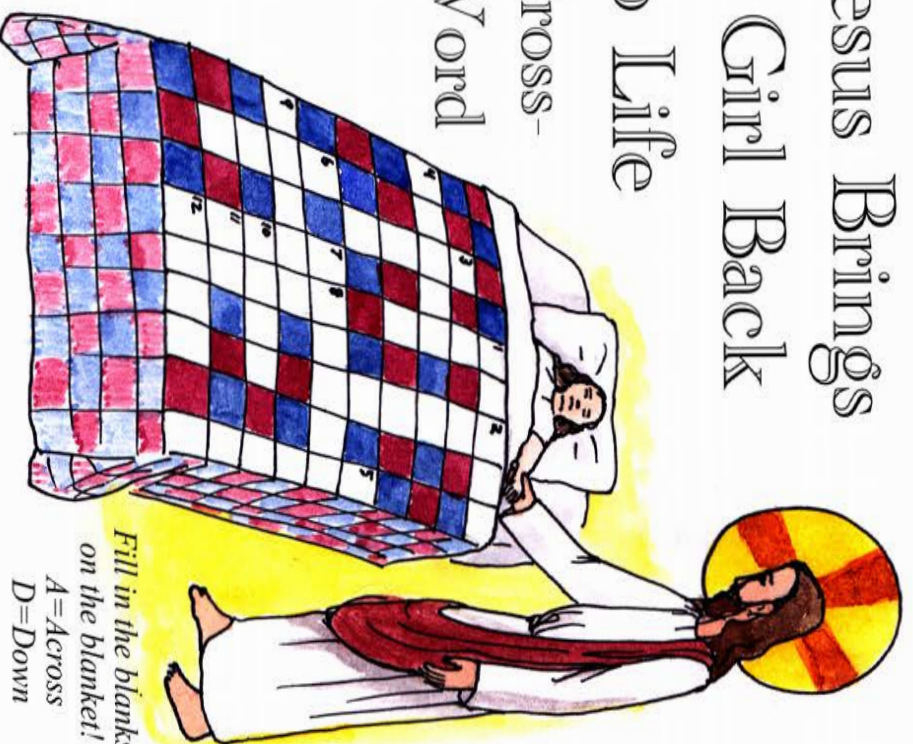
Me too! Have you read Fr. Josemaria's book, "The Way?"

The Dignity of Work & the Rights of Workers - To protect the dignity of work, the basic rights of workers must be protected, including the right to productive work, fair wages, participation in unions, private property, and economic advancement.

Solidarity - We believe we are one human family whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. Pope Paul VI taught, "If you want peace, work for justice." The Gospel calls us to be peacemakers. Our love for our brothers and sisters demands that we promote peace in a world surrounded by violence and conflict.

Care for God's Creation - We show love and respect for our Creator by our good stewardship of creation. We are called to protect people and the planet! This is how we live our faith and honor the Lord.
