Scholarship Program Rules REVISED FOR 2025

1. Purpose of the Amigos en Cristo † Friends in Christ Scholarship Program

Amigos en Cristo † Friends in Christ is committed to the role of advancement and education in our personal and Christian lives. The Amigos en Cristo † Friends in Christ Scholarship Program is intended to celebrate and reward the leadership and academic achievement of our Hispanic youth, and to contribute to the spirit and well being of the Hispanic Community.

2. Terms of the Program

In recognition of demonstrated leadership and accomplishments outside the classroom as well as academic performance, Amigos en Cristo † Friends in Christ will grant individual financial scholarships to selected students who meet the eligibility requirements of the Amigos en Cristo † Friends in Christ Scholarship Program described in section 3.

3. Eligibility Criteria

To apply, an applicant must be a registered parishioner in the Diocese of Arlington, of Hispanic descent, and must be attending or accepted as a student in a post-secondary, accredited college or university program.

4. Application Process

Eligible students will complete the application packet and submit it with the required supporting documentation.

The packet will include a resume highlighting academic achievement as well as involvement in the world beyond the classroom: Church, arts, music, environmental stewardship, community service, athletics, or other areas of interest.

A personal essay is required responding to the topic identified on Page 5. Essays may be typed or hand-written. Your signature is required at the bottom of the essay for it to be accepted.

A letter of recommendation from a member of the clergy, youth program director, or a religious education teacher from your parish is required.

Additionally, the Amigos en Cristo † Friends in Christ Scholarship Committee requires two personal letters of reference to comment on the applicant's character and/or academic performance. The letters must not be from a parent or relative; they should come from counselors, teachers, employers, clergy, etc. Please ensure that contact information for these references are included in the letter, as the Committee may contact these references.

All letters of recommendation must be signed originals or emails from an official email directly to AmigosEnCristoSMOS@gmail.com; copies or forwarded recommendations will not be accepted.

Please note that <u>official</u> transcripts of grades must be submitted. Unofficial transcripts and grade reports are not acceptable. Transcripts may be electronic transcripts from a school or university transcript service, or printed copies in sealed envelopes. Students currently enrolled in college must include all official college transcripts. High school seniors and college students who have completed less than one full quarter or semester of post-secondary education must include their high school transcript.

Applications packets must be complete and submitted either by mail or hand carried to the Saint Mary of Sorrows Parish Center office. The mailing address is:

5. Application Deadline

The application must be received not later than May 30, 2025 to be considered.

6. Selection Process

The Committee will select award recipients on the basis of demonstrated leadership, active involvement in civic and/or religious activities, and academic performance, and quality of the essay. Selected award recipients will be notified by June 10th.

7. Obligations

Award recipients must be enrolled in an accredited two or four year college or university for the year in which their scholarship is granted. Proof of enrollment must be provided to the Committee. Proof of enrollment could be a letter of acceptance for the upcoming academic year for new college students or transferring college students, or current transcripts for current college students.

8. Award Distribution

Scholarship recipients will be recognized at the Amigos en Cristo † Friends in Christ dinner and silent auction on June 21st in Farrell Hall. Scholarship checks will be sent directly to the financial services office of your college. Please ensure that you provide the address to the financial services office of your school, and your student identification number, if you have one.
