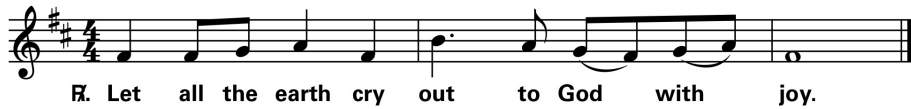
## READING I
