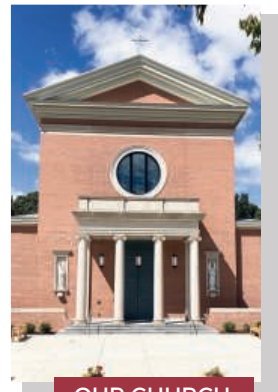
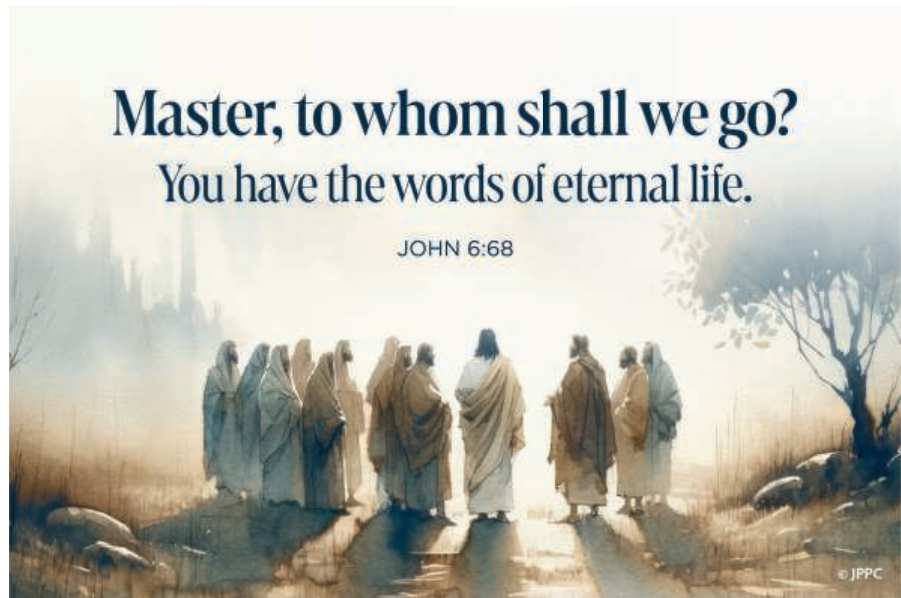

PARISH LIFE

From the Pastor

How many there are who cared for the sick and the dying without any of the advances of modern medicine! Their faith and trust in Almighty God's protection and providence is an example worth considering in our present society.

One recent saint who cared for the poor, the sick and the dying was Mother Teresa. She died September 5, 1997. On September 10, 1946, after seventeen years as a teaching Sister, she sensed a calling from Our Lord to live with and care for the poorest of the poor – in a predominantly non-Christian country: India. On December 21, 1948, she made her first visit to the slums of Calcutta. After daily Holy Communion and Rosary in hand, she went out each day to serve Jesus in 'the unwanted, the unloved and uncared for.' One by one, her former students joined her. Mother Teresa's new congregation, The Missionaries of Charity, was established officially on the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, October 7, 1950. By the 1990s the MCs were in all the former communist countries, including the former Soviet Union, Albania and Cuba.

There is so much to learn from these humble yet capable consecrated women; their joy and care for others – intermingling with their residents freely and without fear, their sensitivity with their residents – physical touch is the language of love, especially to the terminally ill and dying, their daily life of prayer that begins with early morning Mass, Liturgy of the Hours, hours of Eucharistic Adoration and devotion to Our Lady in the Rosary.

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary ~ A TIME OF DEVOTION AND RENEWAL ~

"I am all thine, and all that I have is thine, O most loving Jesus, through Mary Thy most holy and Immaculate Mother."

What is Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary?

Consecration means to set aside for a sacred purpose. Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, as set forth by St. Louis Marie de Montfort, is a beautiful exercise to increase your spirituality and ability to truly serve our Lord Jesus Christ. St. Louis Marie in True Devotion to Mary advises the faithful to prepare for Total Consecration through a series of brief readings and prayers (10-15 minutes each day) which will lead to a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ.

Why do this?

We consecrate ourselves in order to be more devoted to the Lord and His Blessed Mother. Mary's life was set aside for the sole purpose of serving our Lord. By following her example, we, too, can completely give ourselves to Christ in a fundamental way that consecrates us to Him. We give our lives to Him in service and love.

Consecration helps us grow in holiness and increase our faith, hope, and love. It is a prayerful and focused method of drawing closer to Jesus than ever before.

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary was used by † Pope John Paul II † "Reading this book (St. Louis Marie de Montfort's True Devotion to Mary) was to be a turning point in my life.... This Marian devotion...is indispensable to anyone who means to give himself without reserve to Christ and to the work of redemption." How does it work?

The 33-day preparation includes a preliminary period of twelve days during which we endeavor "to free ourselves from the spirit of the world." The initial 12 days is followed by a second period of three weeks. The first of these three weeks is devoted to the knowledge of ourselves, the second to that of the Blessed Virgin and the third to that of Jesus Christ.

When does it begin and end?

The cycle of preparation (daily prayers and meditations take approximately 10-15 minutes per day) which began on August 13 and ends with the Act of Consecration on September 14th after the Saturday 5:00 pm Mass.

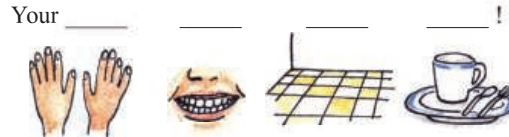

Governments should also work to protect the poor and the unborn.

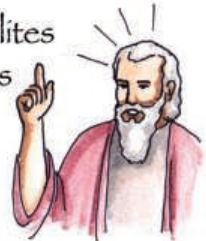

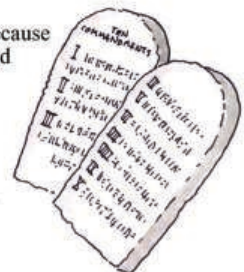
